## Thomas Jefferson: Philosopher of Freedom

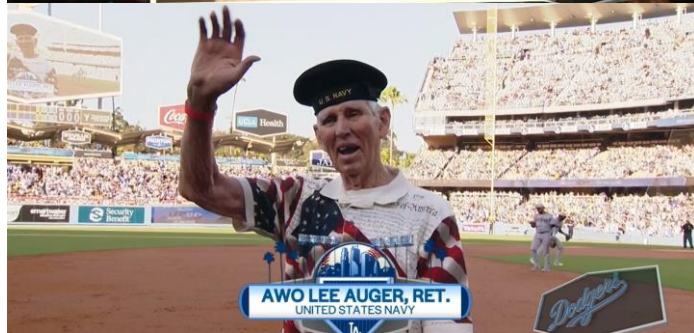
On July 1, 2024, a video titled *Thomas Jefferson: Philosopher of Freedom* was the featured presentation.

Thomas Jefferson was celebrated for his numerous accomplishments as a lawyer, scientist, musician, architect, and author of the Declaration of Independence. The presentation also delved into Jefferson’s upbringing on a Virginia plantation, shedding light on the societal context of his time. It highlighted how his love for nature, fascination for science, and relationships with influential figures during his college years set him on the path to becoming a prominent figure in American history. Despite his shyness, Jefferson built a successful law practice and planned his dream home, a mountaintop retreat offering serenity and meditation.

## **The Carpenters' Story: Only Yesterday**

On July 8, 2024, the featured presentation was a video titled: *The Carpenters' Story: Only Yesterday*

The video celebrated The Carpenters' music, highlighting the chemistry between Karen and Richard Carpenter and their success predominantly through their recordings. The discussion also touched on Karen's struggles with anorexia, the family's move to California for musical opportunities, and the challenges the band faced in securing a recording contract.

The narrator shared the story of how "We've Only Just Begun" became a surprise hit and highlighted A&M Records' marketing and presentation struggles. The host also praised the Carpenters' unique sound, Karen's voice, and Richard's exceptional musical arrangements, as well as their international stardom and success, including a performance at the White House.

The narrator discussed the impact of fame and success on the lives of Karen and Richard Carpenter, highlighting the toll it took on their personal lives and music careers. Karen's struggle with anorexia and Richard's addiction to Quaaludes led to conflict and chaos, including the termination of their contract with their manager. Despite their struggles, their love for each other remained strong, and they continued to create music. The narrator also discussed Karen's tragic death due to anorexia, which highlighted the lack of awareness and understanding of the disease at the time.

The conversation concluded with an emotional tribute to Karen and her enduring legacy.

## **Running Towards the Fire – A War Correspondent's Story**

On July 15, 2024, the featured presentation was a film titled *Running Towards the Fire – A War Correspondent's Story*. Andy Kopetsky had alerted Bob Eisenhart about its existence. The correspondent was Robert Rubin, Andy's wife Alice's cousin.

The film documented Bob Rubin, a World War II correspondent for Reuters, who was the first to enter Europe with the 101st Airborne. It covered the Normandy landings and the D-day invasion, with Robert Rubin's first-hand account of jumping into a hot zone at night, being shot at by enemy planes and machine guns, and chronicling the U.S. soldiers fighting and dying in Europe.

The film also highlighted the crucial role of war correspondents in providing information to the home front and winning public support for the war effort. It discussed reflections on the scale and confusion of war, as described by Ernie Pyle, and the challenges faced by reporters during the Normandy landings. In it, Rubin described a brutal battle between U.S. airborne units and veteran German troops, led by Lieutenant Colonel Cole, and the liberation of Paris. The film emphasized the bravery and sacrifice of war correspondents like Rubin and Bill Stringer, who risked their lives to report on the atrocities of war.

The film's narrator recounted the liberation of Paris, the Battle of the Bulge, and the experiences of war correspondents during World War II.

The discussion focused on the crucial role of war correspondents in maintaining morale among Allied soldiers and keeping the public informed about the conflict. The narration highlighted the bravery and sacrifices of American soldiers, as well as the emotional impact of the war on European civilians. The film also covered the Battle of Aachen and the ensuing winter campaign, which saw the German army launch a last significant counterattack, the Battle of the Bulge.

After the film, Andy recounted that as Alice's cousin. Bob Reuben was remembered as a wonderful man and was loved very much. Alice's father, Philip Reuben, was a physician, and he took care of Bob in his final days.

After the war, Mr. Reuben continued as a correspondent in Guam, Seoul, South Korea, and Manchuria; was an NBC commentator in Manila; a correspondent in Shanghai and Peking (Beijing); an NBC commentator with the Admiral Byrd expedition to Antarctica in 1946-47; a correspondent for the United Nations, NYC 1947-48; and a correspondent in Europe 1948-50 during the Berlin Airlift.

In 1987, Mr. Joseph Laitin, writing for the Washington Post, recalled a chance meeting in Acapulco many years earlier when he and Bob were awaiting a flight back to L.A. Who should appear but bemedaled General Maxwell Taylor, US Army Chief of Staff. The General recognized Reuben and asked, "Reuben, what's become of you?"

It suddenly occurred to Laitin that while the General, who had recently passed, had written a Normandy article for the Post.

Reuben's personal story had never been told; even the Pentagon had no record of his having jumped with the 101st.

According to Reuben, General Taylor was the first out of the C-47; Reuben followed soon after. Reuben had a homing pigeon and a Carbine, the latter in defiance of Geneva Convention rules for a non-combatant. He explained that if he encountered one of Hitler's legions, he was unlikely to be asked for press credentials. The decision to carry a weapon was fortunate because General Taylor had lost his rifle during the jump.

The remainder of the day was spent trying to round up the men of the 101st who were scattered around the Cotentin peninsula in the pre-dawn hours.

Meanwhile, Reuben made it to the beach to secure a ride to the USS Bayfield, anchored offshore and serving as H.Q.s for the U.S. 7th Corps commanded by General "Lightning Joe" Collins. After hearing that General Taylor had made it, General Collins set Reuben up with a typewriter, a shower in the General's private stateroom, and "the best damn breakfast the Navy can offer."

To the point that Bob Reuben's story has never been told, Mr. Laitin and Reuters in London traded letters. A Mr. Pomeroy from Reuters knew Bob personally and used

excerpts from the manuscript for the 50th anniversary of D-Day in June 1994. Bob wanted to pass on the manuscript to the next of kin. Finally, Mr. Entwistle was asked to place some of the material in a number of American papers and try to contact relatives.

After some years of red tape, computer crashes, letters, and personnel changing hands, we obtained a copy in 2012.

This manuscript is over 380 pages long; thus, the documentary covers only part of it.

Some anecdotes from the manuscript are:

The film depicts the incredible danger: in addition to German machine guns and snipers, G.I.s had to deal with flooded fields, hedgerows over eight feet tall, mosquitoes, mines, mud, Rommel hairpins, and 'asparagus,' sunken roads, and an enemy familiar with the area.

Bob always looked for cows in the fields of Normandy because they showed the absence of land mines.

Returning from the USS Bayfield to the 101st, Bob almost drowned. He found a white mare and managed to ride it back to 101st H.Q. Getting around was a function of a correspondent's initiative and luck: Bob had commandeered bicycles, motorcycles, jeeps, horses, rode in the back of troop carriers, on tractors, and horse-pulled wagons.

One of the most valuable assets the correspondents had was the Piper Cub (Grasshopper) artillery observation plane. These were unarmed, and pilots plotted coordinates of German artillery when they saw the flashes. Bob flew on a few missions and said the artillery looked like someone turning a flashlight on and off. Often, the German artillery would stop when the planes went up. The cubs went up over Carentan to stop the very heavy German shelling to aid the Allied advances.

Bob said he feared German Dive bombers more than just about anything in the early days. One saving grace is that the raids didn't last long, but they paid regular visits.

After St. Lo, Bob had a fever and woke up shocked to see that German soldiers were carrying his stretcher. These Germans (prisoners) carried litter, dug latrines, and moved supplies without complaining and without supervision. They did not try to escape.

Along the road to Paris, Bob was embedded under a French command that didn't like journalists. He said they could not have been less helpful, and several times, he broke formation or snuck out under penalty of having his tires shot out to get news back to H.Q.

The reactions of liberated French people contrasted greatly: survivors of many small Normandy towns that were ground to dust by bombs and artillery were totally shell-shocked or unemotional; most city dwellers along the Allied advance were extremely bitter after German occupation and subsequent destruction during withdrawal, and suspected Nazi collaborators were often beaten to death.

Citizens greeted G.I.s on the roads to Paris, often affectionately pulling them out of vehicles with hugs, kisses, flowers, and gifts of special baked black bread. Despite the brief incident of German snipers, Paris was the greatest party of all. In Bob's view, it was overwhelming, and he wanted to be back with the troops en route to Belgium.

Andy and Alice are very grateful to Professor Barney McCoy and the staff and faculty of the University of Nebraska/Lincoln School of Journalism and Communications for helping to tell Bob's story. An added bonus is that we recently attended a reunion and met many wonderful family members for the first time. It was as if we had won the lottery and no one asked for money!

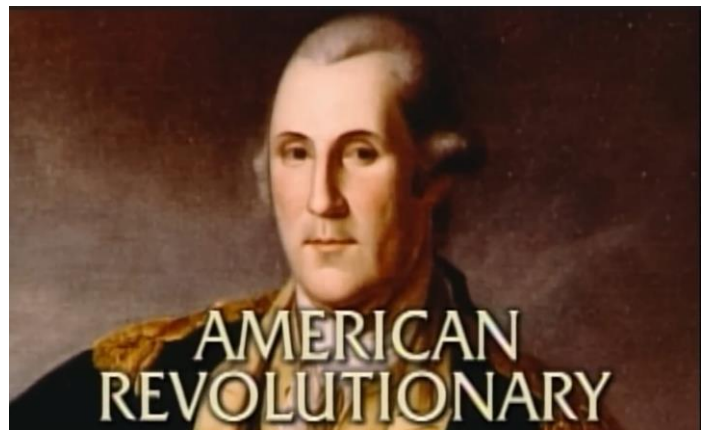

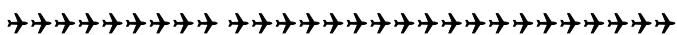
# U.S Navy SEALs: The Silent Option

The featured presentation on July 29, 2024, was a documentary titled *U.S. Navy SEALs: The Silent Option*.

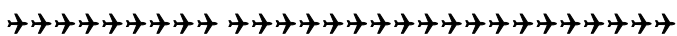
The video was a documentary of the United States Navy Sea, Air, and Land Teams, called the SEALs, a highly respected special forces unit known for their ability to operate in near total secrecy. The SEALs were created in 1962, and their first action was in Vietnam. The narrator emphasized the SEALs’ strategy of winning without fighting a pitched battle, relying on intense violence and shock force to create a temporary appearance of superior strength. He also highlighted the SEALs’ training in sabotage, surprise precision attacks, and their ability to operate independently and aggressively. The importance of preparedness and high readiness in the context of warfare, specifically for special forces like the SEALs, was also emphasized.

The documentary discussed the capabilities and tactics of SEAL units, emphasizing their proficiency in mobility and stealth. It detailed the use of various weapons, including the Desert Patrol Vehicle and the High-Speed Boat, as well as the submarine and the Swimmer Delivery Vehicle. The documentary also highlighted the importance of teamwork and discipline in SEAL operations, comparing it to the samurai’s code.

The narrator discussed the mental and emotional aspects of warfare, emphasizing the importance of controlling fear and avoiding quitting. They highlighted the intense competition and drive for excellence among SEALs, as well as the rigorous six-month training course required for individuals to become a SEAL. He also stressed the importance of discipline and control in the use of firearms, particularly in the context of counterterrorism operations and the need for safety measures. The dangers and capabilities of the U.S. Navy SEALs were discussed, focusing on their high-risk insertion methods and the importance of sneaking up, completing their mission, and returning home safely. The documentary emphasized that SEALs rely on stealth, planning, and individual skill rather than pure firepower.

Wendy’s is one of the biggest fast-food chains in the county, but if its founder, Dave Thomas, had named it a few years later, the restaurant might have been called something totally different.

Before he passed away in 2002, Thomas admitted something pretty surprising to his daughter Wendy: He regretted naming the burger chain after her. “He wanted a character because he worked for the Colonel at Kentucky Fried Chicken and knew how much that persona mattered,” Wendy Thomas explained. “He said, ‘Wendy, pull your hair up in pigtails.’ So, I did. He got his camera and took pictures of me and my sister and said, ‘Yep, it’s going to be Wendy’s Old-Fashioned Hamburgers.’” However, as time went on, Thomas realized that having his daughter as the namesake for his ultra-popular restaurant might not have been the best idea.

“Before my dad left us, we had a long conversation about him naming the restaurant Wendy’s. It was the first time we’d ever had this conversation,” Thomas said. “He said, ‘You know what? I’m sorry.’ I asked him what he meant. He explained, ‘I should’ve just named it after myself because it put a lot of pressure on you.’” Though she might have been surprised by her father’s revelation, the brand’s namesake said she agreed that it put a lot of pressure on her. However, she wouldn’t have had it any other way today.



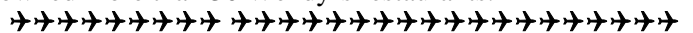
As a child, she was unable to pronounce her L’s and R’s, struggling with her own name, Melinda, and so became known by her nickname Wendy.

The eight-year-old would eventually become the namesake of her father’s restaurant, Wendy’s Old Fashioned Hamburgers, or just “Wendy’s” for short. In addition to being the namesake, her likeness, a young freckle-faced girl in red braids, was used as the Wendy’s logo.

Thomas graduated from the University of Florida in 1983 with a bachelor’s degree in consumer behaviorism.



As of September 2010, Wendy Thomas owned or co-owned more than 30 Wendy’s restaurants.

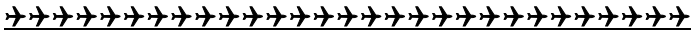

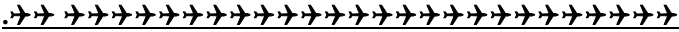

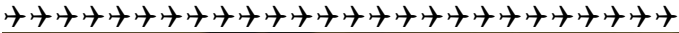

As a young man, Richard Dunner devoted his life to serving others. At the age of 23, he joined the Hollywood Lodge #382 of the Knights of Pythias.

Richard received a Bachelor of Arts Degree from Cal State University of Los Angeles in 1969 and started a teaching career with the Los Angeles Unified School District in 1970. At the same time, he continued to serve in various offices in the Lodge and earned the title of Past Chancellor on December 31, 1975.

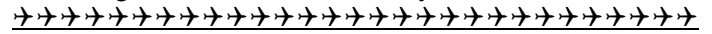
In addition to his teaching and work in the Lodge, he returned to school and received a Master of Arts Degree
